Handpicked Subscription Boxes

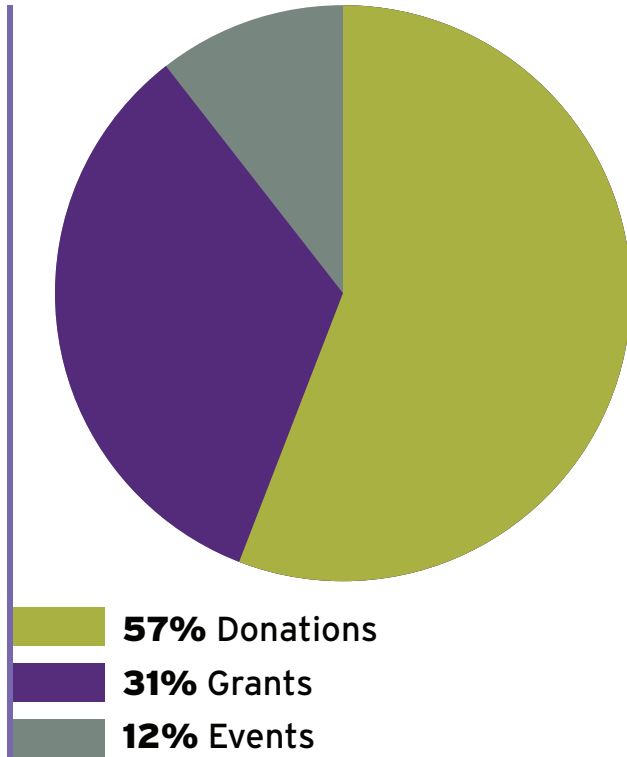
In November we kicked off our outreach program, *Handpicked by Hope House*. Monthly boxes with gifts and necessities went to nine moms.



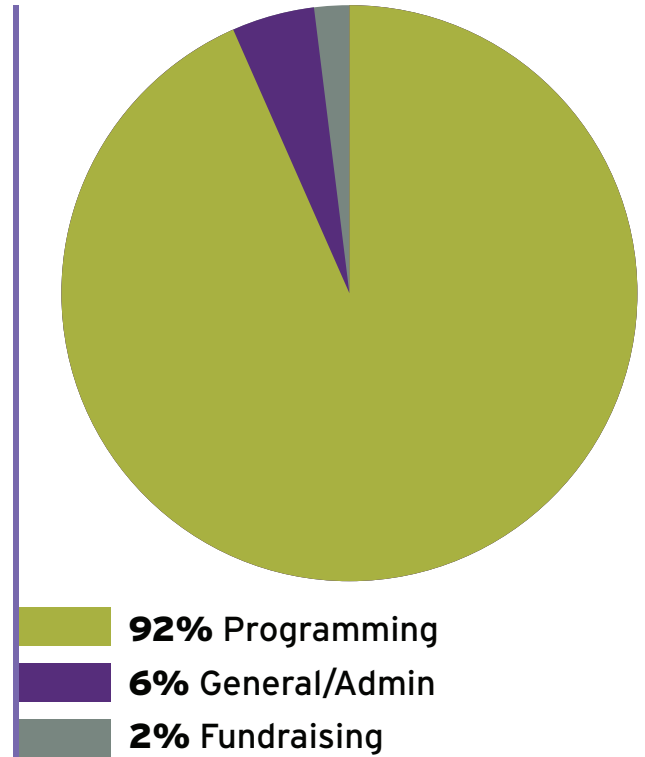
